The heavy crop last year combined with last year's drought reduced the volume of late season apple varieties for picking this year. This will reduce the availability of apples for picking, but because of our big crop of early apples like Honey Crisp we have plenty of great tasting apples in our cooler that should last through the month of October. We are planting 100's of apple trees every year so please be patient as we care for these baby trees that will bring us some of the best tasting new varieties that we have ever been able to offer.

I want to thank all of our faithful customers for sticking with us over the years. We have finally gotten our strawberries, blackberries, and peaches (to name a few) to a production level that easily meets demand, but we are working hard to get caught up on apple production. Over the next couple of years our apple selections and overall production will increase exponentially. We are very excited about the flavor and texture of some of our new apple varieties and look forward to sharing them with you.

We will have the following apple varieties in our market this Fall:

Honey Crisp – now through October

Fuji , Golden Delicious – now through October

Nittany – after the 1st of October

Cameo, Stayman, Granny Smith, York – beginning October 15th

Pink Lady – late October

Pawpaws – through September

We will also have plenty of pumpkins, winter squash, apple butter, cider, pies, and our homemade jams and jellies. And don't forget our Chef Tana's great recipes served fresh every day at our market.
